
A few other things you should know:

- 1. We still cannot provide transportation at this time. This will not resume until social distancing measures can be relaxed in society in general.
- 2. Students need to bring a bagged lunch for the event, or could possibly get food from the court in the mall (this isn't guaranteed though).
- 3. Students need to wear masks at all times, and it is recommended to bring a face shield if at all possible.
- 4. Students need to fill out a wellness check before they leave Saturday morning, the link will be placed on the robotics website under the event.
- 5. There will not be any spectators allowed at the event. The event coordinator explained to me that anyone else in that space would take any available spots from other teams, because of the occupancy limits and COVID restrictions. Although this is again disappointing, they are putting in a tremendous amount of effort and caution to host these events, and I think we need to just celebrate that normal 2v2 matches will finally be occurring this season. This will take place in the JCPenney's in the mall, and as such, I do not believe that parents will have any access to view live matches at all. The entire event will be livestreamed though.
